History

- City of La Center relied heavily on Gambling Taxes for revenue
- Lawsuits from Vancouver, Clark County, The La Center Cardrooms and the group "Citizens Against Reservation Shopping"
- Alienated from our neighbors with very little conversations and no partnership



New Relationship

- ► There is new leadership in La Center & at The Cowlitz Tribal Council
- A new partnership is being formed
- Multiple meetings involving members of the city staff and Council



Around The Community

- ▶ In 2022 Cowlitz Tribal Foundation donated \$190,000 to La Center Schools
- Northwest Battle Buddies \$450,000.00 to support the training of eighteen battle buddies that will be gifted to our veterans experiencing PTSD
- In May 2023, our unrestricted funds allowed The Cowlitz Tribal Foundation to donate \$550,000.00 to 38 food pantries in Clark County to help address SNAP reduction benefits
- Boys and Girls Club Southwest Washington 1 million Dollar Grant to support staff and development
- WSU Vancouver 1 million Dollar Grant to support the building of a new academic building

Interlocal Agreement

- The Tribe has purchased two parcels east of the freeway
- ► The United States Government has discretionary authority to take land into trust on behalf of a tribe
- The new IGA consists of doubling our sales tax rate



Letter Of Support

- For the two parcels already purchased
- Gets the clock started
- City of La Center supports stronger ties with the Cowlitz Tribe
- Builds trust
