

SEPA DETERMINATION OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE

City of La Center Chapter 18.60 Development Agreement Code Updates (File # 2021-030-ZON/SEPA)

Description of proposal: The City of La Center is updating its code pertaining to Development Agreements contained in LCMC 18.60. The purpose of the code update is to provide more specificity regarding what provisions of the City's development code can be modified under a development agreement by:

- Limiting the range of uses allowed in a development agreement to permitted and conditional uses in the applicable zoning district.
- Specifying that the term of a development agreement is limited to 10 years and can be extended for an additional 10 years with the City having the right to require compliance with new codes and impose additional public benefit requirements at the time of extension.
- Allowing for density increases of 20 percent in a given phase of a project in the MDR-16 zone, but requiring overall density across the project to meet zoning requirements.
- Allowing for increases in building coverage and impervious surface increases of up to 60 percent in the LDR-7.5 zone.
- Prohibiting modification to the following codes and standards: (1) LCMC 18.300, Critical Areas (2) The City's adopted Shoreline Master Program (3) LCMC 18.310, Environmental Policy (4) LCMC 18.320, Stormwater and Erosion Control (5) LCMC 18.360, Archaeologically Sensitive Areas and (6) Title 15, Buildings and Construction.

Any person has the right to comment on this SEPA DNS, receive notice of and participate in any hearings, and appeal the final decision on the code amendment. Existing Environmental Documents relied upon: The State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) requires that a review of the potential environmental impacts be conducted. City staff reviewed the proposal for compliance with applicable state requirements and city codes.

Statement of Determination: As lead agency under the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) rules [Chapter 197-11, Washington Administrative Codel the City of La Center must determine if there are potential significant adverse environmental impacts associated with this proposal. The options include the following:

- Determination of Significance (DS) The impact cannot be mitigated and therefore requires the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).
- Mitigated Determination of Nonsignificance (MDNS) The impact can be mitigated through conditions of approval, or;
- Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS) The impacts can be addressed by applying the city codes.

Approval Standards/Applicable Laws: La Center Municipal code section 18.30 (Procedures).

Mitigation Measures: The review of the SEPA checklist associated with this proposed code amendment did not recommend any mitigation measures.
