CONNECTING OUR COMMUNITY

After six months of closure and another month of limited use, the community center kitchen at Holley Park finally reopened this past September for full use! The public kitchen received its Level 1 Permit from the Clark County Environental Public Health and Food Safety which means we are now in compliance to allow groups and individuals a place to prepare and serve meals, especially for catering businesses, Meals on Wheels and the Lions Club. We Want to thank our community for all of their patience during the time of renovations.

LOW INCOME REMINDER

2024 is just around the corner and that means not only a new year but also a new tax season. If you are currently receiving a discounted rate on your sewer and stormwater bill, you must provide your 2023 proof of income and household size to City Hall by May 31, 2024 to see if you still qualify for a discounted rate. Included income could be any one or more of these examples: Federal Taxable Wages, Tips, Self- employment income, Unemployment compensation, Social Security, Social Security Disability Income (SSDI), Retirement or pension income, Capital gains, Investment income, Rental and royalty income, and Excluded (untaxed) foreign income. Household size includes: dependent children, including adopted and foster children, children (shared custody) only during the years you claim them as tax dependents, children under 21 you take care of, dependent parents (only if you'll claim them as a tax dependent), non-dependent children other

relative living with you (only if you will claim them as tax dependents), dependent siblings and other relatives (only if you'll claim them as tax dependents), spouse (must files taxes jointly, or, living apart unless you are legally separated or divorced), and unmarried domestic partner (only if you have a child together or you'll claim your partner as a tax dependent).

If we do not receive your 2023 proof of income and household size by May 31, 2024, then your discounted rate will be removed and your sewer/stormwater bill will resume at a regular rate. If you are not receiving a discounted rate and want to see if you qualify, you can contact Desi Allinger-Nelson in Finance at 360-263-8656, or stop by City Hall in person.

FLOOD INSURANCE

The City's new Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) went into effect on November 2, 2023. City staff will be reaching out to individual property owners who may be impacted by the new map change. The area that has been mapped into a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) include several parcels along Brezee Creek. Properties located in a SFHA are required to obtain a floodplain permit for any development on site.

BUSINESS SPOTLIGHT

What drives Mark's passion to teach? "I believe that we all have the responsibility to add value to our relationships and community. I have personally experienced the physical and self-improvement benefits of Martial Arts training, and I've also seen the positive changes in my students. After teaching for over three decades, I am still excited to share this Art with others and add value to my community." Mark is also most proud of when his students start with him at five years old and he trains them until they graduate from high school. During that time, he notices that those students have become leaders in their peer groups and do well academically, always with a great attitude and a positive influence to their peers.
