

SEPA DETERMINATION OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE City of La Center Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Updates (File # 2023-027-ZON/SEPA)

Description of proposal: The City of La Center is updating its code provisions pertaining to its Critical Areas Ordinance (CAO) for frequently flooded areas (LCMC 18.300.090[3]) per Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) requirements under the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). The purpose of the code update is to be compliant with FEMA and Title 44 Code of Federal Standards (CFR) Sections 59.1, 60.3, and 65.12. Compliance with these requirements ensures that property owners can continue to obtain flood insurance if their properties are located in frequently flooded areas which are the FEMA mapped Special Flood Hazard Areas. The code updates include:

- Amending critical areas definitions (LCMC 18.300.030) to include new definitions and amend existing definitions as mandated by FEMA.
- Amending LCMC 18.300.090(3) for the permitting and/or prohibiting of the storage of materials and equipment in frequently flooded areas.
- Amending LCMC 18.300.090(3) to adopt by reference the updated Federal Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) panel that goes into effect November 2, 2023, with additions of area along the lower reaches of Brezee Creek.
- Amending the responsibilities of the local administrator to include receiving certification for floodway encroachments, records of all variance actions, and improvement and damage calculations and notifying based flood elevation changes to the Federal Insurance Administrator within six months of receiving information and data on such change.
- Amending conditions for variances of historic structures in frequently flooded areas upon a determination that the proposed repair or rehabilitation will not preclude the structure's continued designation as a Historic Structure and the variance is the least necessary to preserve the historic character and design of the structure.
- Adopt provisions to prohibit the storage and equipment of specific materials that could be injurious or harm human, animal, or plant life if released due to damage from flooding in frequently flooded areas. Otherwise, storage and equipment may e allowed if not subject to damage by floods and firmly anchored or readily removable within the time available after flood warning.
- Adopt provisions to allow development in the floodway with certain requirements, including requiring the applicant to apply for a Conditional Letter of Map Revision (CLOMR) with FEMA.

Any person has the right to comment on this SEPA DNS, receive notice of and participate in any hearings, and appeal the final decision on the code amendment. Written comments submitted by September 12, 2023, at 5:00 PM will be considered. Location of proposal: The update will apply to frequently flooded areas with FEMA FIRMs within the City's boundaries. These areas include the East Fork Lewis River and the lower reaches of Brezee Creek. The updated FIRMs specifically update mapping along the lower reaches of Brezee Creek.

Public Hearing: La Center Planning Commission public hearing, September 12, 2023, at 6:30 p.m. Meeting will be conducted in person at City Hall at 210 E. 4th Street and virtually using the City's GoToMeeting online platform. A separate public hearing notice will be issued

Existing Environmental Documents relied upon: The State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) requires that a review of the potential environmental impacts be conducted. City staff reviewed the proposal for compliance with applicable state requirements and city codes.

The following environmental documents were relied upon in the City's determination of a DNS: SEPA Environmental Checklist dated, August 28, 2023. A complete copy of the code amendments and the SEPA Checklist associated with this determination are available by contacting the City Clerk at 360-263-7665.

Statement of Determination: As lead agency under the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) rules [Chapter 197-11, Washington Administrative Code] the City of La Center must determine if there are potential significant adverse environmental impacts associated with this proposal. The options include the following:

- Determination of Significance (DS) The impact cannot be mitigated and therefore requires the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).
- Mitigated Determination of Nonsignificance (MDNS) The impact can be mitigated through conditions of approval, or;
- Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS) The impacts can be addressed by applying the city codes.

Approval Standards/Applicable Laws: LCMC 18.30.110 (Type IV Process); LCMC 18.120.050 (Approval Criteria); LCMC 18.300 (Critical Areas) and CFR 59.1, 60.3, and 65.12.

Mitigation Measures: The review of the SEPA checklist associated with this proposed code amendment did not recommend any mitigation measures.
