

SEPA MITIGATED DETERMINATION OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE City of La Center Low Density Residential (LDR-7.5) Front Setback Code Update (File # 2023-018-ZON/SEPA)

Description of proposal: The City of La Center is updating its code pertaining to the minimum front yard setback standards in the LDR-7.5 zone. The code update will exclusively affect LCMC 18.130 (Low Density Residential District). The purpose of this code update is to provide the option to reduce the minimum front setbacks from 20 feet to 10 feet when providing additional architectural features. The front setback code updates would include:

- Requiring all dwellings allowed in the LDR-7.5 zone to provide a minimum front-loading garage setback of 20-feet, regardless of the minimum front yard setback for the living area;
- Requiring the garage to be setback at least 3 feet from the front living area setback reducing the front living setback;
- Adding the ability to reduce the front living area setback to 15 feet by providing at least 5
 architectural details from a menu of details including belly band cladding, dormers, pillars/posts,
 knee/eave braces, window trim no less than three inches wide, bay windows, shutters or louvers, and
 keystones/decorative window trim;
- Adding the ability to reduce the front living area setback to 13 feet when providing 4 architectural details in addition to the 5 architectural details to reduce to 15 feet. This includes a menu of details including a covered porch area, variable siding, varied exterior wall offsets, fronts facing garage doors with windows on no less than 15% of the garage door, a recessed building entry, use of contrasting materials, such as brick or stone, on no less than 15% of the façade, at least three color changes across the façade, and other architectural elements as approved by the planning official;
- Adding a review process for a project that opts to use the reduced front yard setback provisions.
 This includes providing elevations and a completed checklist of the architectural details selected to reduce the front living area setback; and
- Requiring that an applicant who utilizes the front yard setback reduction cannot request a variance to
 reduce the front living area setback less than 13 feet. Also, the front living area setback that is less
 than 15 feet but no less than 13 feet cannot be applied when a dwelling has direct lot access to a
 classified arterial road.

Any person has the right to comment on this SEPA mitigated determination non-significance (MDNS), receive notice of and participate in any hearings, and appeal the final decision on the code amendment. Written comments submitted by August 8, 2023 at 5:00 PM will be considered. Existing Environmental Documents relied upon: The State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) requires that a review of the potential environmental impacts be conducted. City staff reviewed the proposal for compliance with applicable state requirements and city codes.

The following environmental documents were relied upon in the City's determination of an MDNS: SEPA Environmental Checklist dated, July 24, 2023. Statement of Determination: As lead agency under the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) rules [Chapter 197-11, Washington Administrative Code] the City of La Center must determine if there are potential significant adverse environmental impacts associated with this proposal. The options include the following:

- Determination of Significance (DS) The impact cannot be mitigated and therefore requires the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).
- Mitigated Determination of Nonsignificance (MDNS) The impact can be mitigated through conditions of approval, or;
- Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS) The impacts can be addressed by applying the city codes.

Approval Standards/Applicable Laws: LCMC 18.30.100 (Type IV Process) and LCMC 18.120.050 (Approval Criteria).

Mitigation Measures: The review of the SEPA checklist associated with this proposed code amendment includes the following mitigation measure:

Noise & Air: The second tier reduced front setback provision (less than 15 feet but no less than 13 feet) cannot be applied to a dwelling fronting an arterial classified roadway.
