

SEPA DETERMINATION OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE

City of La Center Manufactured Homes Code Update (File # 2023-012-ZON/SEPA)

Description of proposal: The City of La Center is updating its code provisions pertaining to manufactured homes. The code update will primarily affect LCMC 18.180 (Manufactured Homes), but provisions in other code chapters including LCMC 18.40 (Definitions), LCMC 18.130 (Low Density Residential District), LCMC 18.140 (Medium Density Residential District), LCMC 18.150 (Commercial Districts), LCMC 18.158 (La Center Junction Plan Zoning District), LCMC 18.165 (Mixed-Use), LCMC 18.247 (Accessory Dwelling Units), and LCMC 18.280 (Off-Street Parking and Loading Requirements). The purpose of this code update is to:

- Ensure manufactured homes regulations are compliant with applicable State requirements in RCW 35.21.684 and 35A.21.312 and the GMA mandated comprehensive plan and regulations periodic update process.
- Allow individually sited manufactured homes in all zones where site-built homes are allowed consistent with RCW 35.21.684.
- Modify the permitted uses and conditional uses for manufactured homes, manufactured/mobile home subdivisions and communities, and throughout each of the City's zones. Manufactured homes will be permitted uses in the Low Density Residential (LDR-7.5), Medium Density Residential (MDR-16), Residential Professional (RP), Downtown Commercial (C-1), Cardroom Overlay District (C-3), Junction Plan District (JP), and Mixed-Use (MX) zones. Manufactured home subdivisions and communities will be a conditional use in the LDR-7.5, MDR-16, and RP zones and prohibited in all other zones.
- Modify the definition of manufactured homes, manufactured home subdivisions/communities, mobile homes, recreational vehicles, and modular homes.
- Modify manufactured home and manufactured home subdivision and communities siting, installation, and design standards.
- Allow the locating of a manufactured/mobile home in manufactured/mobile home communities that were legally in existence before June 12, 2008, when in compliance with RCW 35.21.684(2)(a).
- Allow the entry of recreational vehicles in manufactured home communities when in compliance with fire, safety, and local regulations and provides utility hookups.
- Allow manufactured homes as an ADU.
- Modify parking requirements for individually sited manufactured homes and manufactured home subdivision and communities to require two spaces for an individual manufactured home or two spaces plus one guest space per five homes in communities and subdivisions.

Any person has the right to comment on this SEPA DNS, receive notice of and participate in any hearings, and appeal the final decision on the code amendment. Written comments submitted by May 9,

Location of proposal: The update will apply in the Low Density Residential (LDR), Medium Density Residential (MDR), Residential Professional (RP), Downtown Commercial (C-1), Cardroom Overlay District (C-3), the Junction Plan District (JP), and Mixed Use (MX) zones.

Public Hearing: La Center Planning Commission public hearing, May 9, 2023, at 6:30 p.m. Meeting will be conducted in person at City Hall at 210 E. 4th Street and virtually using the City's GoToMeeting online platform.

Existing Environmental Documents relied upon: The State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) requires that a review of the potential environmental impacts be conducted. City staff reviewed the proposal for compliance with applicable state requirements and city codes.

The following environmental documents were relied upon in the City's determination of a DNS: SEPA Environmental Checklist dated, April 24, 2023. Statement of Determination: As lead agency under the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) rules [Chapter 197-11, Washington Administrative Code] the City of La Center must determine if there are potential significant adverse environmental impacts associated with this proposal. The options include the following:

- Determination of Significance (DS) The impact cannot be mitigated and therefore requires the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).
- Mitigated Determination of Nonsignificance (MDNS) The impact can be mitigated through conditions of approval, or;
- Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS) The impacts can be addressed by applying the city codes.

Approval Standards/Applicable Laws: LCMC 18.30.100 (Type IV Process) and LCMC 18.120.050 (Approval Criteria).

Mitigation Measures: The review of the SEPA checklist associated with this proposed code amendment did not recommend any mitigation measures.
