## **Community Center,** is **Community**

Community Development recently advertised a contract and plans to remodel the Community Center Kitchen and parking lot repair. The bids were opened, and the construction project was awarded to the low bidder by City Council on January 25. Work will start on the kitchen in the next one or two months, depending on the length of time to receive the kitchen equipment. The Community Center building will be closed until the kitchen remodel is completed. parking lot will be closed as necessary to reconstruct the parking lot in early summer.

#### **Let That Sink In**

Public Works staff have handled an emergency culvert repair in response to a sudden sink hole on 5th street that appeared in January of this year. You probably noticed the detour signs along 4th street and the round-about directing traffic away from 5th street. Staff acted quick in preparing and contracting the work through a bidding process to begin the much-needed repairs. The City engineer monitored the project throughout construction and it was completed in early February. 5th Street was reopened for use.

FUN FACT: In 1883 the first bridge at the East Fork of the Lewis River was built at La Center preceding five replacement bridges. The bridge was replaced in 1894 with a draw bridge for Sternwheeler travel, in 1903 and 1917 with turn-style bridges, and in 1924 with a concrete bridge which was demolished in 1980 to facilitate direct access to I-5.

Located at 630 E Birch Avenue in La Center, Podunk Pizza had a soft opening in February and invites the community to their grand opening ribbon cutting ceremony on Saturday, March 18 at 5:00 p.m. Owned by Tosha Emerson and her husband Anthony, the pizza place is focused on family, fresh ingredients, a rotating menu, music, and fun. "This was an idea in the making a few years ago as we have two boys in sports [they attend La Center High School] and there wasn't a place in La Center to take the family for a dinner right after a game or practice," stated Tosha. Tosha and her husband have many years of experience and ownership in catering and the culinary arts. "I am a small town girl with a lot of country," says Tosha when telling how she came up with the name Podunk Pizza. She was reading the history of John and Hannah Timmen where she learned that La Center was originally named Podunk. The menu will be done in phases and rotated through the seasons. You will find pizza, appetizers and desserts right away but watch out for the pasta line (all handmade), gourmet pizzas and summer salads coming soon. Podunk Pizza Company is also offering catering services for corporate and private events, family game night, trivia night, and live music with outdoor seating in the near future.
