

March 2022 - Reported Crimes


March 2021 – Total Crimes Reported = 12




March 2022 - Arrests





Community Messaging

- Please lock your cars, especially when you are parked overnight in front of your home.
- Remove all cell phones, purses, wallets, and vehicle keys from your car at night.
- On April 19 our officers received remote training on the use of Naloxone (Narcan). This will allow our officers to have the ability to administer naloxone at the scene of an overdose. This training is provided by Clark County Public Health, and they will also provide our doses of Naloxone.
- Chief Richardson met with La Center School District Superintendent Peter Rosenkranz to discuss community issues. We have decided to meet every two weeks to increase communications between the police department and the school district.
